- Direct Support Groups meet outside of weekly calls
- 2-3 Conveners for each group
- Weekly calls continue to take place includes high level/high impact updates, collective learning.
- Partners sign up for direct support areas of choosing

Power-shifting, Dreaming

Legacy and Structure - Truth and Reckoning

- Pandemics reveal and increase inequity.

- For BIPOC, resilience is our baseline, not our benchmark.
- For PWIs and white people, reckoning the harm and undue benefits of white supremacy is fundamental to building beloved and righteous community.
- We build loving community to build loving power to build loving systems.
