

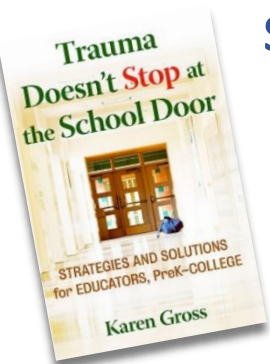
How to Reopen Schools Optimally in the Fall: Planning, Preparing and Predicting

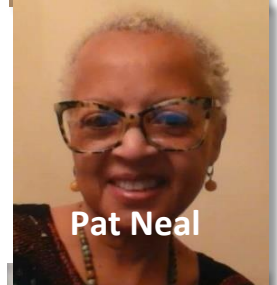
