This course gives the foundations for trauma-informed service, as developed by SAMHSA, with a focus on adults with developmental disabilities. Staff will learn the six core values of a trauma-informed program and the skills that can allow adults with developmental disabilities to be able to develop skills for safety, self-regulation and self-determination. In addition, staff will learn the neuro-sequential model, as developed by Dr. Bruce Perry, in order to better interpret behavior and related needs. Staff will also assess their own self-care and be able to identify specific ways to increase self-care.

#### **Training Objectives:**

- 1. To give staff a deeper understanding of why people with trauma behave in ways that may appear illogical or self-destructive.
- 2. To allow staff to address physical and emotional safety issues in a way that will engage clients.
- 3. To train attendees on specific practices that are trauma-informed.
- To allow staff to care for themselves and to understand the impact of trauma on their health, world-view and job performance.
