Healing Our Relatives, Part 1: Trauma-Informed Approaches in Indian Country

Discussion Topics

This learning community will include an overview of trauma-informed (TI) approaches, as well as a description of American Indian and Alaska Native (AI/AN) cultural interventions that utilize TI approaches. Historically, AI/AN communities have always included ways of healing in their ceremonies, stories, songs, and prayers. More recently, communities and groups have developed activities based on a greater understanding of the importance of creating a supportive, healing environment to address historical and current trauma. These include Gathering of Native Americans, talking circles, and cultural events.

In this webinar, participants will: understand the impact of trauma on communities and recognize the signs and

symptoms of trauma; identify ways of healing that do not re-traumatize individuals and communities, but rather create an environment of healing; be able to identify at least two AI/AN interventions that use TI approaches; and engage in interactive discussions about TI approaches and how local prevention efforts can be strengthened when prevention staff utilize this knowledge in their daily work.

Part 2 of the series is scheduled for April 23, 2015 and Part 3 will be on July 23, 2015.

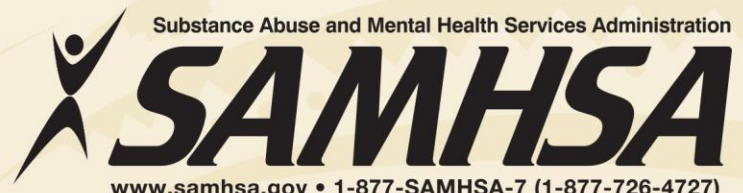
