Fresno County Trauma & Resilience Network is a collection of institutions that have a common desire to make our communities trauma informed for the purpose of building resilience in our youth, families, neighborhoods and county. We have representation from Fresno County Dept of Public Health and Behavioral Health, Fresno Police Department, hospitals and health clinics, universities, school districts, local businesses, local legislative representatives and more than 40 local Community Based Organizations.

What We Do

- We are currently conducting a study on ACE's in public housing.
- The Fresno Police Department Chaplaincy program is networking with other CBOs to build capacity in addressing trauma with elementary school aged students.
- Our local universities are working toward adding an understanding of ACEs to their teaching credential programs.
- Exploring how the Network can glean community ACE scores in certain geographic areas of our county.
