Mandated Reporter Resources Now Available

The Mandated Reporter Training is a project funded by the OCAP and carried out by the <u>Chadwick Center for Children and Families</u> at <u>Rady Children's Hospital - San Diego</u>. The Mandated Reporter Training provides an overview of the significant definitions, requirements and protections of the California Child Abuse & Neglect Reporting Act. Licensed child care program staff are required to complete the training to learn the best practices for mandated reporting of suspected child neglect or abuse.

The Online Training Includes:

- How the law defines child abuse and neglect
- What the law requires of you as a mandated reporter
- What protections the law provides for a mandated reporter
- How to spot evidence of child abuse
- How to report child abuse
- What happens after a report is filed
- Definitions of some of the terms used in this program

This training may take up to 4 hours to complete. You will receive a Certificate for your records upon completion of the training.
