# Caught in the Crossfire Model

- Program Goals
  - Prevent Retaliation
  - Prevent Reinjury
  - Decrease Arrest Rates
  - Inform and Train Individuals and Groups on Alternatives to Violence



# The Sacramento Violence Intervention Program

- Immediate Response
  - Serving clients between the ages of 15-26
    - Shot, stabbed, assaulted
    - Residing within the designated service area
  - Bedside visit within 1 hour of hospital contact
    - Client support
    - Family support
    - Retaliatory violence intervention



# The Sacramento Violence Intervention Program

- Follow-up Care and Case Management
  - Co-design Individualized Case Plan
    - Health
    - Psychosocial
    - Education / Career
  - Intensive Case Management for 6 months to 1 year

# Violence and Crime

- Youth Violence is a National Issue
  - Homicide is the 2<sup>nd</sup> leading cause of death for youth in the U.S.\*
  - Third Party Homicide is the 1<sup>st</sup> leading cause of death among African American Youth
- Trauma in South Sacramento
  - Violent injury is the 3<sup>rd</sup> leading cause for a hospital trauma visit\*\*
  - Over half of all violence-related injuries are among 15-24 year olds

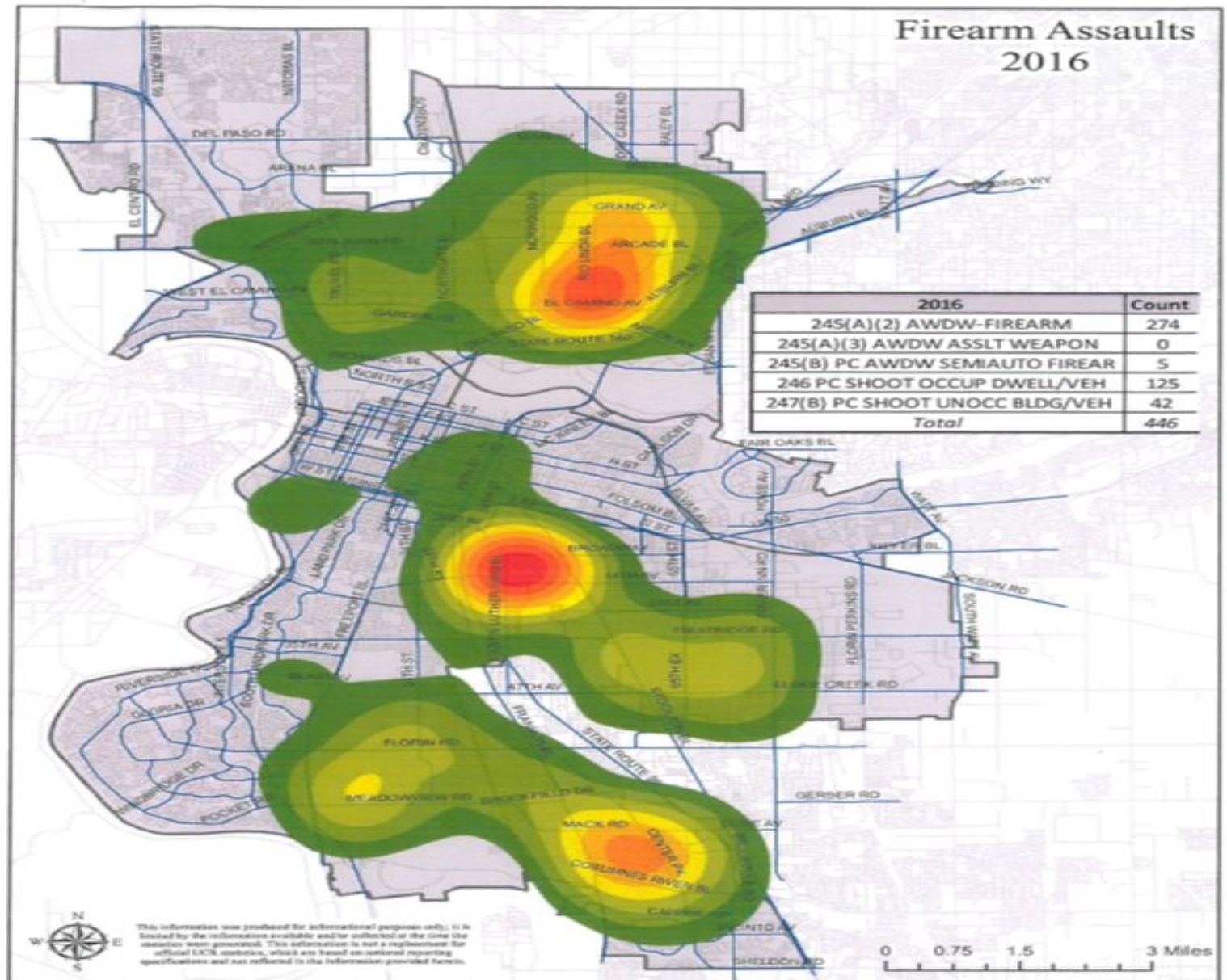
# Public Health Problem: Violence Mimics Infection\*

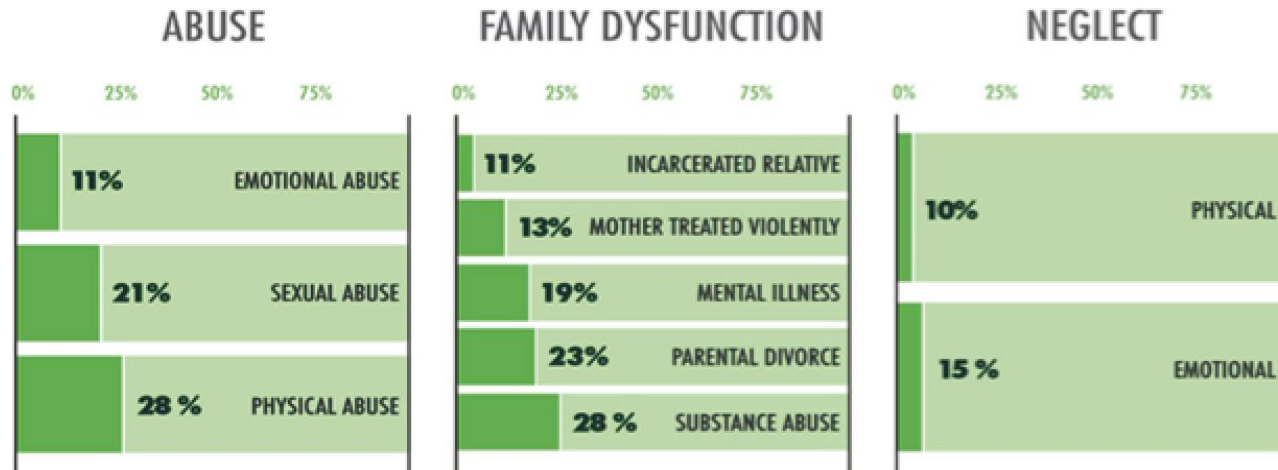


# ACE's

ACE's – Stands for “Adverse Childhood Experiences”. This is the term given to describe all types of abuse, neglect, and other traumatic experiences that occur to individuals under the age of 18. This landmark Kaiser ACE Study examined the relationships between these experiences during childhood and the reduced health and well-being later in life.



## Adverse Childhood Experiences Are Common



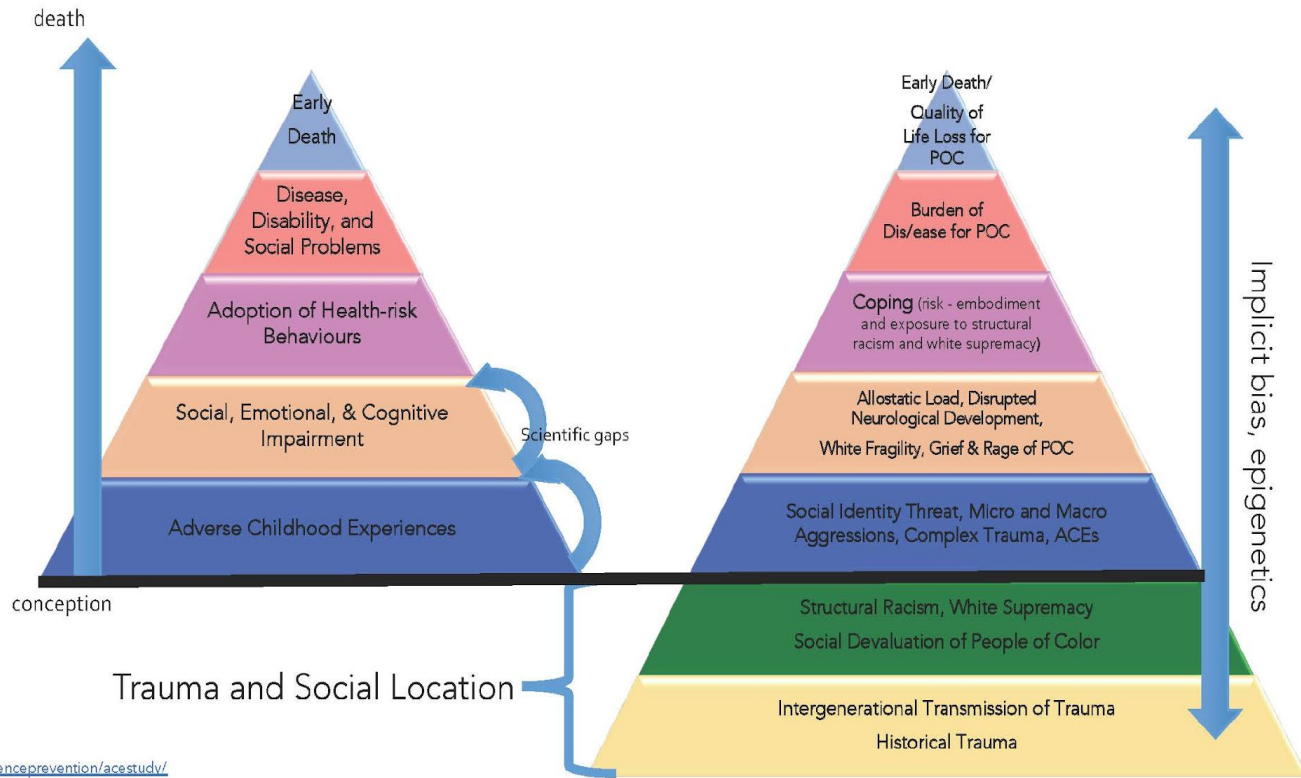

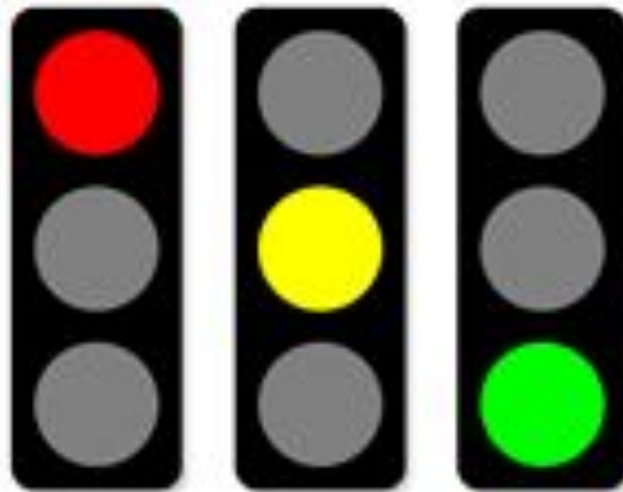
## Historical Trauma/Embodiment of Oppression
