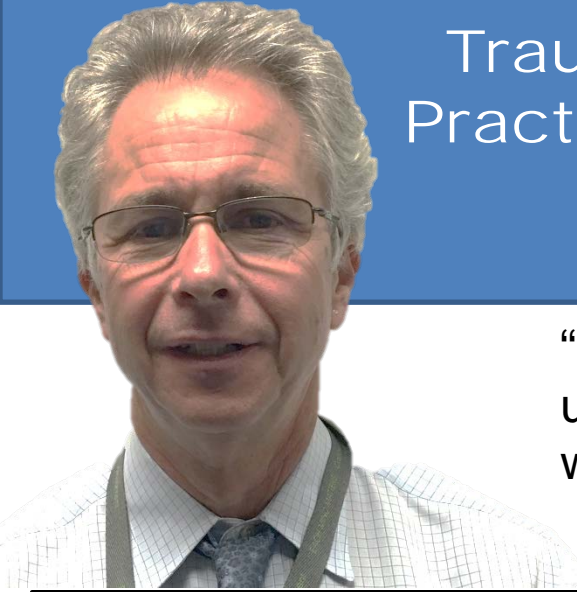


Trauma- and Resilience-Informed Practices: A New Era in Human and Healthcare Services

Dr. Ken Epstein is the Children’s System of Care Director for San Francisco County Community Behavioral Health Services, and leads the vision and implementation of the Trauma Informed Systems Initiative. He has convened numerous groups of trauma experts and interagency collaborations within the Bay Area, including the Bay Area Trauma Informed System of Care (Trauma Transformed) Initiative.

Dr. Epstein has also served as a line worker, clinician, program director, professor and chief executive officer. Dr. Epstein is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker with a Ph.D. in clinical social work.

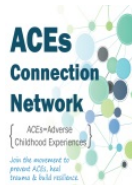
