


### The Issue



Adverse Childhood Experiences & Adverse Community Environments.

- associated effects of poverty and joblessness


contribute to – and compound – the adversities experienced within households by children and families.

#### At an individual level:

- delays in learning
- behavioral issues
- physical and mental health conditions

## Adverse Childhood Experiences have been linked to-



As the number of ACEs increases, so does the risk for these outcomes.

## At a community level:

- Poor child and family outcomes
- Lack of economic growth
- Communities in decline

#### A Possible Solution



Increase resilience by promoting the capacity of individuals, families, and communities to develop, implement and sustain their own solutions to problems in a way that helps them shape and exercise control over their physical, social, economic and cultural environments.

# An Ongoing Invitation Grow Community Resilience

Focus on resilience as a fundamental strategy to prevent & reduce chronic disease by addressing the root causes of adversity. (Poverty, Discrimination, Poor Housing Quality & Affordability, Community Disruption, & Lack of Opportunity, Economic Mobility, & Social Capital)

Recognize many socially vulnerable populations possess some resilience. (consistently bounce back from daily onslaught of adverse conditions)

**Build** upon this understanding & aim higher by providing a framework for collaboration & coordination between large systems & community members.

Foster collaboration & develop strategic partnerships.
