Healthy Futures for Foster Youth (AB 366)

Currently, the state is parent to more than 900 parenting youth in foster care and grandparent to their children. Unfortunately, the state does not provide foster youth with a prenatal income supplement, thus leaving this group of young expectant parents alone to face greater hurdles in preparing for childbirth. AB 366 will ensure that expectant youth in care are supported with good nutrition and parenting skills, as well as securing the vital items for the newborn's health and safety.

AB 366 will also ensure that the benefits of sexual health and education programs are available for all California's foster youth. By making sure our foster youth have the resources and access to information vital to their lives, we can close the gap in disparate health outcomes between foster youth and other California youth.
