In June 2015 the Association of Maternal & Child Health Programs added MVCCP to its *Innovation Station* as a national Promising Practice

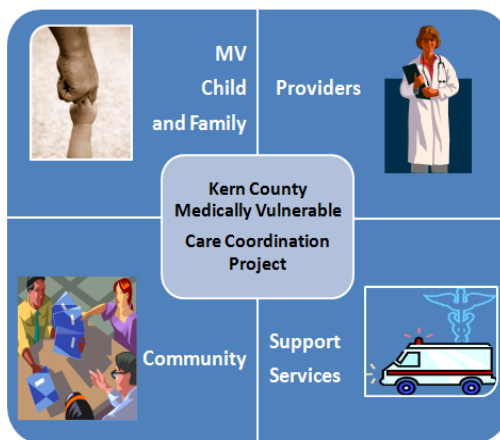


## MVCCP Project Background

Since 2008, over 50 partner organizations have met monthly at First 5 Kern as the Kern County Medically Vulnerable (MV) Workgroup to address the needs of medically vulnerable infants and children (0-5 years of age) and their families.

## MVCCP Project Goals

- ✦ Greater understanding of available resources for MV children and families
- ✦ Better, more timely diagnoses
- ✦ Enhanced coordination of health care and support services
- ✦ Consistent health insurance coverage
- ✦ A medical "home" for all children
- ✦ Timely access to specialized services
- ✦ Greater efficiency and effectiveness of the system of services in Kern County.

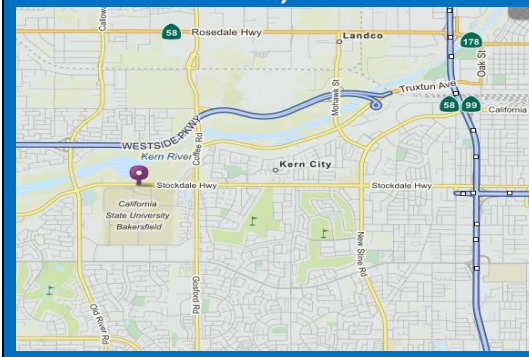

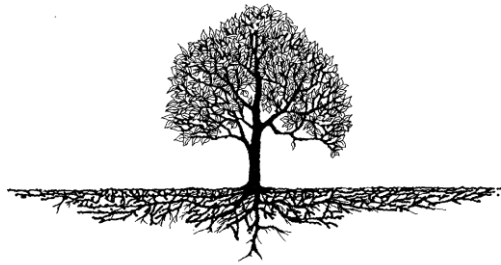
