Minnesota student survey

- Collaboration between Minnesota Schools and Depts. of Education, Health, Human Services, and Public Safety
- Administered in first half of 2016 to students in grades 5, 8, 9, and 11
- 85% of public school districts participated in 2016
- Statewide sample size = 168,733





Seven* ACE Items


- Incarcerated parent/caregiver
- Living with someone who drinks too much alcohol
- Living with someone who uses illegal drugs or abuses prescription drugs
- Verbal abuse
- Physical abuse
- Household domestic abuse
- Sexual abuse

*Some people include additional items, such as measures of poverty and/or dating violence













Students reporting that they feel others care about them "very much" or "quite a bit":



- ■Other adults in the community care














Strategic Prevention Framework

SPF Step	Tasks
Assessment	•Review existing data on ACEs and related protective factors •Collect new data on needs, resources and readiness
Capacity Building	 Share data with community stakeholders Mobilize support for prevention efforts Provide training on ACEs and resilience
Planning	■Prioritize which data points to act on ■Identify strategies to implement
Implementation	■Implement prevention strategies with individuals, families, schools and communities
Evaluation	•Continually gather and monitor data to measure success

Assessment and Prioritization

- Which specific ACEs are most prevalent in your community?
- Which protective factors are most strongly associated with buffering risks?
- Which protective factors does the community most need to strengthen/enhance?
- Which factors does your community have the necessary resources and readiness to tackle?
