The Building Healthy Communities (BHC) initiative statewide includes 10 outcomes identified as the main ingredients of community health:

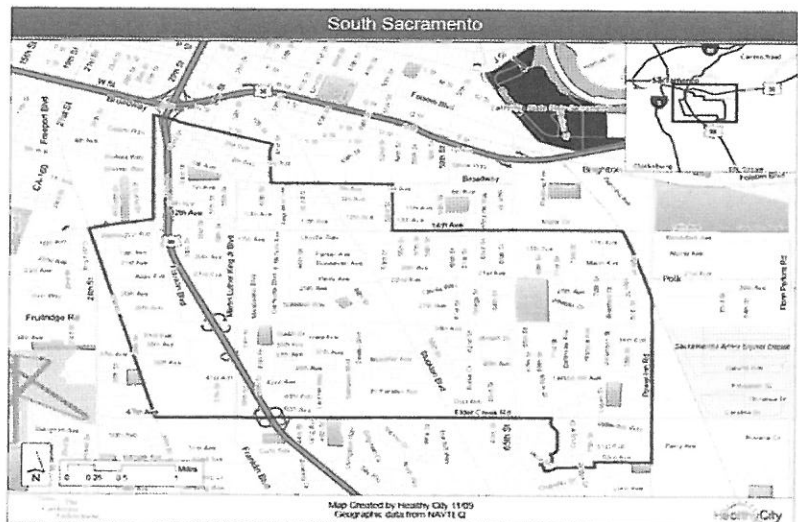
1. All children have health coverage.

The Black Child legacy Campaign, is a community-driven movement, established by the Steering Committee on Reduction Of African American Child Deaths. Their goal is to reduce deaths of African American children by 10%-20% by 2020. The other communities involved are;
