LISTEN

- Let your friend know you really care by talking to him/her seriously
- Tell your friend that, although right now suicide seems like the answer to their problems, there are always other solutions.
- Listen to their feelings, not just their words.

ACT

- Don't keep secrets about your friend's intentions
- Ask your friend to call the hot line for advise and counseling
- If they won't call, YOU CALL!
