**Expert Training and Best Practices: May 19 and 20**, the Trauma-Resiliency Collaborative (TRC) and the Utah Coalition for Protecting Childhood (UCPC) will host an educational symposium to mitigate the gap between the effects of trauma and barriers to health. The *Next Steps Symposium* aims to educate about *Trauma-Informed and Resiliency-Focused* practices, which promote health and well-being. The interactive trainings will feature keynote national experts, who will address best practices, as well as local and regional experts from within our community, who will share practical tools and resources.

**We don't see what we don't understand.** The costly long-term effects of adverse childhood experiences and other forms of toxic stress across the life span cannot be overestimated. Yet, these adversities have predictable outcomes that have been overlooked for decades and lead to serious problems: poor physical and brain health, learning and behavioral problems, major household and relationship dysfunction, under-achievement and high school drop-out, poor work performance and unemployment, judicial and criminal involvement, and decline into and perpetuation of intergenerational poverty, progressive addiction, absenteeism, and long-term disability.

**We can empower by learning to see, speak and educate.** Unifying the language of *Trauma-Informed and Resiliency-Focused practices* is an important first step toward health and well-being for the individual, school or workplace, family, and community. As we look beyond behaviors, we break down barriers—collectively facilitating healing, health, and well-being.
