Linda and Valerie gave a very informative presentation on NAMI San Diego, which is the largest NAMI affiliate in the nation! They shared about the organization's origins, resources and programs, including as CYF liaison for BHS (providing feedback to BHS about problems, policies and positives) and particularly highlighting the vital (trauma-sensitive) function of family support partners in supporting and engaging consumers and their families.
