Mental Health

- Barrier
 - Challenging to hold one another and non-trauma-informed employees accountable, especially as a manager and in a trauma-informed manner.
 - Trauma-informed trainings are often mandatory, which can create resistance and isn't very trauma-informed
- Solutions
 - Include training in on boarding process.
 - Have common definition of trauma-informed for agency
 - Worksheet with trauma-informed and non-trauma-informed language examples

Community Organization/Nonprofit

- Barrier
 - No wrong door and challenges in meeting this goal
 - Informing staff
- Solutions
 - One-page info sheet for staff to utilize
 - Make sure supervisors are trauma-informed and able to support staff and be competent to address situations with staff
 - Cultural responsiveness include in trainings to support this with staff (culture, gender, etc..)
 - Ongoing training important not just one time or reactive training; make it part of the culture/norms

Higher education

- Barriers
 - Silos are challenge
- Solutions
 - CSUSM created groups made up of different colleges within the school with governance by group with representatives from each college, including students
 - Organizations must understand self-care to support staff not just be trauma-informed for youth and families
 - Create workshops/activities for students/staff
 - o Trust is essential, especially with marginalized people or immigrants

Education K – 12

Barrier



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- o Data can be used as a weapon in schools
- Negative data collected and no flexibility with documentation options (ex. Assault for 1st grader pushing a peer at recess)
- Teachers required to review records before start of school year; gives teacher a preconceived notion of the students based on negative documentation

Solutions

- Seal behavior records at the end of every year and teacher only looks at records if problems occur
- o Teacher must request access.
