Trauma Recovery & Empowerment Model for Men (M-TREM)



Lori Beyer is the Director of Trauma Training Education at Community Connections in Washington D.C. She was an original member of the Community Connections Trauma Work Group which developed the Trauma Recovery and Empowerment Model. Ms. Beyer specializes providing workshops and consultation, and has over 23 years of experience working with adults who are dually diagnosed with a serious mental illness and substance abuse disorder, have histories of homelessness and violent victimization.

TREM – Trauma Recovery and Empowerment Model, is an evidence-based practice and is listed on SAMHSA's National Registry of Evidence-based Programs and Practices. TREM was developed by Maxine Harris and Lori Beyer at Community Connections. M-TREM, The Trauma Recovery and Empowerment Model for Men is a fully manualized group-based intervention designed to facilitate trauma recovery among men with histories of exposure to sexual and physical abuse. Drawing on cognitive restructuring, psychoeducational, and skills-training techniques, the gender-specific 24- to 29-session group emphasizes the development of coping skills and social support. It addresses both short-term and long-term consequences of violent victimization, including mental health symptoms, especially post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and depression, and substance abuse. M-TREM has been successfully implemented in a wide range of service settings (mental health, substance abuse, criminal justice) and among diverse racial and ethnic populations.

Who Should Attend: Health, social service, criminal justice & homeless services professionals, addiction counselors, public officials, educators, community leaders & other interested individuals.

Full Day Program: Includes presentation by one of the developers of Men's TREM and a curriculum workbook for each Workshop participant. Morning refreshments and boxed lunch included. Free parking.
