Paper Tigers chronicles a year in the life of Lincoln High School in the rural community of Walla Walla, Washington. The kids who come to Lincoln have a history of truancy, behavioral problems, and substance abuse. After Lincoln's principal is exposed to research about the effects of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), he decides to radically change the school's approach to discipline.

The film intimately examines the inspiring promise of Trauma Informed Communities — a movement that is showing great promise in healing youth struggling with the dark legacy of untreated "toxic stress," a term used to describe how traumatic childhood experiences affect developing brains.
