
Terms and Definitions

Immigration Status:

- **Refugee**: granted status in country of origin. Has had health screening there.
- Asylum Seeker: got here by legal or illegal means, typically has had no health screening.
- **Asylee**: Granted asylum here, may or may not have had any medical attention.
- U-Visa: Special visa for victims of crime (here).
- **T-Visa**: Special visa for victims of sexual trafficking.

Who Are Our patients?

- Approximately 230 patients
- More than half are female
- Majority from Eritrea and Guatamala
- 59 % Torture
- 32% FGM: Majority Type IIb



Recurring Themes

- Eritrea: Military conscription, prolonged imprisonment under inhumane conditions, forced positioning, beating.
- Guatemala: anti-indigenous racism, vigilante group conscription, short imprisonments, beating, rape, particularly indigenous women.
- El Salvador, Honduras, Guatemala: gang-based violence, gunshot wounds, kidnapping and torture, rape, IPV. Persecution of LGBTQ.




Recurring Themes

- Mexico: persecution of LGBTQ, IPV, cartelbased violence, pts often bystanders who are caught up by cartels or by police.
- West Africa: Persecution of LGBTQ. Politically based violence with assassinations, imprisonments and beatings.
- FGM: Mainly Type II in Eritrea and Ethiopia, more Type III in West Africa.



Current Process




Physical and Psychological Evidence of Torture/Abuse


Specific Signs: Tramlines
