<p><b>Resource and Referrals/FVCPP</b> Walk-ins meet with a Client Navigator who will assess their needs and provide resources and referrals. Services include: information and referrals; assistance in translating and completing applications; scheduling appointments with the Mexican Consulate, and residency card renewals (Woodland by appointment only for residency card renewals). Case management available to assist with long term needs. <p><b>Housing First Program</b> Housing assistance for survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and human trafficking</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Must be a survivor of sexual assault, domestic violence, and/or human trafficking</li> <li>● Homeless or home insecure</li> </ul>

<p><b>Family Support and Groups</b> Activities promoting social connectedness including, but not limited to: yoga, Spanish-speaking women’s support group, exercise classes, sewing, Club de Lectura, and Ballet Folklorico.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Open to all in the community, but some programs are facilitated in Spanish only.</li> <li>● Call each location for specific date and time</li> </ul>
<p><b>ASSETS</b> After School Safety and Enrichment for Teens (ASSETS) program provides academic support, safe and constructive alternatives for high school students. <p><b>Family Legal Clinic</b> Assistance with child custody and divorce for survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and/or human trafficking</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Survivor of domestic or sexual violence and/or human trafficking</li> <li>● Call for an appointment. Due to high demand, appointments are booked out 2 months</li> </ul>
<p><b>Therapy</b> Therapy services for adult survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence, stalking, and human trafficking. Therapy services for child survivors of abuse including, witnessing domestic violence, child sexual abuse, community violence, and bullying.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Must walk-in to complete intake paperwork</li> <li>● Short-term for adults</li> <li>● No limit for children</li> <li>● For adult and child survivors as previously defined</li> </ul>
<p><b>Batterer’s Intervention Program*</b> A certified 52-week program which provided anger management and batterer intervention. *Please note there is a sliding scale fee</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Self-referrals can schedule and appointment by calling 530-661-6336</li> <li>● Court-ordered must be referred from probation</li> <li>● Enrollment fee of \$50 - must be money order</li> <li>● Men’s group only, referrals available for women.</li> </ul>
