RESILIENT YOLO

HISTORY:

In 2012 a small group came together in a collaborative effort by Yolo County's Probation department to compete for a multi-year Positive Youth Justice Initiative Grant award. This group of non-profit organizations and individuals found themselves bonded and committed to the idea of spreading awareness of childhood adversity and the importance for community health in addressing it. The group was inspired by the work and dedication of ACEs Connection founder Jane Stevens, and received early support from many in the education field when the documentary Paper Tigers was released. Resilient Yolo emerged and began hosting screenings and holding forums which connected educators around Yolo County with training in principles that bring trauma-informed awareness into our school systems.

That Resilient Yolo support and promote partnerships between its membership and the larger community, actively and intentionally prevent and address the traumas associated with Adverse Childhood Experiences and Adverse Community Experiences (ACEs), including those particular to marginalized minority populations, in its outreach, education and programming.
